WHAT DOES A MILD WINTER MEAN?

SPAY AND NEUTER! We are coming into "official" spring shortly but have had mild weather most of the winter. Not only do April showers bring May flowers, but a warm winter brings early kitten season! Cats spontaneously ovulate and it is believed to be coordinated with the warmer weather. If you see a free roaming cat in your neighborhood, please get it fixed before the one turns into an entire litter. We are already getting calls about pregnant females and litters of kittens. "Prevention, not destruction."

We are already seeing mosquitoes and ticks in February due to the record warm temperatures! We encourage you to use monthly flea/tick and heartworm prevention early this year. Lyme disease vaccines are also available through most vet clinics. The American Animal Hospital Association places the average monthly cost of prevention at \$5-15 per dog, whereas treatment is \$400-\$1000. Heartworm in cats is not treatable and fatal.

FERAL AND FREE ROAMING FRIENDS

If you or someone you know is looking for "green" rodent control, please consider an ABF funded barn cat! ABF trappers often find cats that cannot be safely returned to their colony. These cats can range from friendly and able to be handled to truly feral. Cats are all spayed and neutered, ear tipped and rabies vaccinated. Depending on the trapper, they are often flea treated, dewormed and further vaccinated too. These cats aren't just for barns, they make great shop cats, are wonderful for businesses, warehouses, greenhouses and more!

We received a facebook message about at least 6 cats living in the greenhouse. A veteran trapper headed out with someone who had previously been trapping in her yard to show her the ropes. Kim is our new star trapper at George's! Occasionally we have a funny story: we were told about a GIANT cat and even shown pictures. One morning, while dropping other cats off at the vet, Kim sat with board member Sarah and received a call the GIANT cat was in the trap. Kim got almost to the store when she received another call that the GIANT cat in the trap was in fact misidentified and this one was a raccoon. We all got a good laugh and continue to wait for the giant cat to enter. In the meantime we continue to trap. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN VAN BUREN?

Van Buren trappers have been busy with lots of projects too but here is one very special case. Meet Wreck It Ralph, affectionately named because of his severe injuries. Van Buren County trappers, Jim Parker and Marcie Bremmer



received a call about an injured kitten and rushed right out to trap it. He was brought to Eighth Street Vet the next morning by ABF founder, Karen King. Ralph immediately underwent surgery to flush and close a very large wound that was presumed to be from an animal attack. It was not safe to return him to his original location and he needed to recover for at least 4 weeks so he went to the Paws Fur Learning Classroom. The students, board member Sarah, and a licensed veterinarian will oversee his recovery and care. After he is healthy and 100% socialized, he will be adopted out. PAWS FUR LEARNING



Animal's Best Friend and the Paws Fur Learning students have been working hard together! In just over two weeks, together they helped with three different situations on the same street in Vicksburg. The first case was Mimi, a pregnant calico from a barn and the tom that impregnated her. She came into the classroom where it is safe to deliver her kittens. The students helped trap the tom; he was neutered, ear tipped and returned to his

barn. A couple houses down, a neighbor passed away. The students helped intake 5 cats, transfer 2 dogs to rescue and evaluate 3 cows plus 6 horses. We have named this project the Munn Memorial Project. You can sponsor a spay/neuter for any of the cats or dogs using this designation. \$40 sponsors one cat, \$80 sponsors one dog. Sadly, another neighbor passed away, the Brock TNR project. A very well intentioned woman was feeding outdoor cats but never got them fixed. The students trapped all 6 in one night.
